APEX-ACH Updates

IAT Preparedness: Next Steps

New rules regarding transmission of International APEX Transactions (IAT) become effective September 18, 2009. In March, we provided you basic information during our "IAT and the RDFI" webinar, and promised a future web event to discuss specific system changes and testing information. APEX-ACH Contingency Processor Chosen

To strengthen our already solid measures for APEX-ACH Contingency Planning, Kansas Corporate has selected Mid-Atlantic Corporate Federal Credit Union as our contingent ACH processor. In the event U.S. Central is unable to process ACH receipt activity from the Federal Reserve Bank (FRB) and distribute it to us and our credit unions, there are two primary contingency plans that may be executed. The first involves restoring our systems at the Business Recovery Site (BRC); the second invokes a contingency splitter program. While both contingency plans work and are tested periodically, KCCU has opted to sign agreements to use Mid-Atlantic's ACH product as a secondary safety measure. Prior to this change, contingency situations resulted in an inability to originate returns, a result of the splitter program utilized by US Central. To alleviate this situation, our ACH processing will now be rerouted to Mid-Atlantic Corporate during contingency situations, allowing us to continue ACH processing as usual, including ACH origination.

As always, credit unions are encouraged to save or archive template information. All APEX-ACH users utilizing the template functionality need to ensure copies of templates are maintained as these templates will not be set-up and stored for contingency processing purposes. Template detail can be pulled off old reports or you can also print hard-copies of your individual templates for your records.

Back Office Conversion Project

A back office replacement to enhance APEX-ACH functionality and ensure the highest level of service-level standards, as well as to convert to a new PEP+ application, is scheduled to occur November 13, 2009. Much work has been dedicated to this conversion to guarantee a seamless transition for all users. However, due to the likelihood that historical data will NOT be converted during this process, we ask that your current process of archiving your APEX reports be performed prior to our conversion date of November 13, 2009. APEX-ACH users should save all reports to a secondary location in case they are needed following the conversion.

Pandemic Plan | A/H1N1 Update

In September 2006, we notified member credit unions of our Influenza Pandemic Plan. Included in our Business Continuity plan, the KCCU Influenza Pandemic Plan details necessary steps to prepare for an influenza pandemic, which occurs when a new subtype of influenza (such as the H1N1 virus commonly referred to as the Swine Flu) adapts into a strain that has not previously circulated in humans and against which none of us has any pre-existing immunity, resulting in several simultaneous epidemics worldwide.

As of May 4, 2009, the WHO (World Health Organization) reported a total of 985 confirmed cases of influenza A/H1N1 (Swine Flu) in twenty countries. The WHO has defined 6 distinct phases of pandemic awareness for categorizing the current pandemic threat and alerts the world with threat updates as needed. In the past two weeks, the threat level was increased from Phase 3 to Phase 5. Phase 5 states – Larger cluster(s) but human-to-human spread still localized, suggesting that the virus is becoming increasingly better adapted to humans but may not yet be fully transmissible (substantial pandemic risk).

Kansas Corporate has identified the appropriate actions to take during each of the 6 WHO phases and is keeping a watchful eye on the situation. Internal measures to ward off the spread of infection have been instigated, staff has been thoroughly educated on steps to take if the situation was to worsen, and an adequate supply of hygienic supplies has been acquired.

To date, the actions of the WHO and the recent spread of A/H1N1 has had no impact on the operations of Kansas Corporate. Business continues as normal. If the situation should change, you will be notified immediately of any changes that directly affect your ability to communicate with and continue processing business as usual. The KCCU Influenza Pandemic Plan is in place to ensure continued service to credit unions during such times as these as we understand the importance and criticality of maintaining operations for you and your members.
